

# Emergency Radiology

We are pleased to announce that our journal 'Emergency Radiology' (Ron Zagoria, Editor-in-Chief) has achieved an Impact Factor of 2.2.



## EMERGENCY RADIOLOGY Journal Update RONALD J. ZAGORIA, MD, FASER, EDITOR-IN-CHIEF

Emergency Radiology, the official journal of the American Society of Emergency Radiology (ASER), the Nordic Forum for Trauma and Emergency Radiology (NORDTER), and the Japanese Society of Emergency Radiology (JSER), is prospering. Manuscript submissions in 2024 increased 27% compared to 2023 and continue to increase substantially in 2025.

The quality of the submitted articles is likewise improved in 2024 as evidenced by a 35% increase in publications compared with 2023 and with continued increase in 2025. With the increase in volume and quality of manuscripts the journal is including a high proportion of original reports and of review articles. Even with the increased volume of manuscripts coming to the journal, our turnaround times for editorial decisions and publication have decreased substantially, thanks largely to our wonderful and devoted reviewers. The proportion of our articles published using the Open Access model has risen substantially to 22% for 2024 compared to 10% for 2023. Articles published with Open Access allow full availability free of charge for users.

The impact factor for Emergency Radiology in 2025 is 1.3, comparable to other subspecialty imaging journals. The “real world” impact of our journal is substantial and increasing, with over 244,000 full article downloads from Emergency Radiology in 2024, our highest annual number yet. It will be even higher in 2025.

Recently, we offered the option of submitting a “visual abstract” with accepted manuscripts. These give a quick and graphic summary of an article and are more amenable to dissemination via social media. This option has rapidly been accepted by our authors with 70% of articles in 2025 having a visual abstract.

The journal is thriving. We have a great team that efficiently produces a journal we can be proud of. For our reviewers and authors, I thank you for the work you do and the time you generously contribute for our journal. You are the cornerstone of our success. We have delivered a high quality journal and are able to succeed through our alliance with ASER, NORDTER, and JSER.

## WINGED CADUCEUS AWARD

**O. CLARK WEST, MD, FASER, FACR**

**Memorial Hermann Red Duke Trauma Institute  
UTHealth McGovern Medical School**

**About the Award**

The Winged Caduceus Award is bestowed upon an ASER Member in recognition of an exemplary, career-long service to the Society and Emergency Radiology. This award symbolizes achievements in advancing the Society mission to a national and international audience. To be considered, one must: be an ASER Gold Medalist; demonstrate many years of continuous service to the Society, beyond that expected on the Executive Committee; and have verifiable evidence of his/her relevant achievements. The award is a crystal monolith engraved with a modern caduceus, which is presented by an ASER member at the Annual Awards Ceremony. To date, there have been 5 awardees: Bob Novelline, Stu Mirvis, Kathirkamanathan Shanmuganathan (aka Shan), Diego Nunez and Clark West. Clark was awarded the Gold Medal in 2009.

**Education and Training**

Clark earned his Biology BA degree in 1982 from Drake University and his Doctor of Medicine degree from Washington University. He then trained in Internal Medicine for 2 years at Barnes Hospital, followed by Diagnostic Radiology Residency at the Mallinckrodt Institute of Radiology from 1988 through 1992. He underwent fellowship training for 6 months each in Trauma and Musculoskeletal radiology at Maryland Shock Trauma and Mallinckrodt, respectively.

**Career in Emergency Radiology**

After spending 4 years as an attending musculoskeletal radiologist at Mallinckrodt, Clark moved to Houston, Texas in 1997, where he still practices. For nearly 3 decades, Clark served as Chief of Emergency Radiology. He has trained hundreds of residents, over a dozen fellows and built his section from 3 faculty to more than 10, transitioning faculty coverage from day time only at 1 hospital to 24/7/365 at 2 hospitals.

**ASER Service and significant achievements**

Clark joined ASER in 1992 and has served on at least 14 committees, chairing at least 5, since 1995 (Membership, Bylaws, Annual Meeting Program, Executive, Fellowship, Education, Website, Strategic Planning, Honorary Awards, Protocols, "Appropriateness, Technical and Equipment", Site Selection, MOC, and Editorial).

Clark was perhaps the first ASER member with a vision for what we now know as the ASER Learning Academy. He first came up with this idea more than 2 decades ago, even before we launched the Core Curriculum Illustration Project around 2003. He was a catalyst in transitioning the Society governance from a president run organization to a tiered leadership model, and this occurred at a time when the Society leadership pipeline was very lean, requiring a temporary change from 1-year to 2-year presidency terms, 2002 - 2014. Clark was instrumental in the addition of Emergency Radiology into the ACR GSR (general, small, rural) Commission, now called the GSER. Prior to this change, Emergency Radiology was excluded from the ACR Commissions. Over 10 years ago, Clark proposed the concept of developing our own credentialing/certifying process at a Strategic Planning meeting, and this is now being developed. Clark also served as the spark for transitioning Stu Mirvis' celebrated Emergency Radiology textbook to ASER Ownership.

**Other Emergency Radiology Achievements**

Clark was a founding Faculty of the ACR Learning Center's Weekend in the ER Course. He has served as Course Director of ARRS and RSNA Categorical Courses in Emergency Radiology, Chair of the ACR Emergency Radiology Committee, on an ACR Appropriateness Criteria Panel (Cervical Spine), and Liaison to the American College of Surgeons – Committee on Trauma (ACOS-COT). As the Liaison to the ACOS-COT, Clark negotiated a transition to radiologists monitoring performance standards, rather than surgeons, in pertinent "Orange Book" entries.

**At McGovern Medical School/UTHealth Houston**

Clark continuously served on medical school committees between 1997 and 2010: Informatics Committee, Faculty Senate, GME Committee, CME Advisory, and Orthopedic Chair Search Committee to name a few. He was Vice Chair of Clinical Operations in the Department of Diagnostic & Interventional Imaging for 13 years and Chief of Emergency and Trauma Imaging for 23 years.

**At Memorial Hermann Hospital (MHH) and MH Healthcare System (MHHS)**

Clark has been on multiple hospital committees throughout his career in Houston, including Trauma Reporting Line, Emergency Services Performance Improvement, Emergency Center Service Line, Medical Information and Radiology Information Committees, PACS Design, Trauma Service Line and Multidisciplinary Peer Review, MHHS CPCs Radiology and Acute Care, and Medical Staff Affairs.

**Publications and Presentations**

Education and, to a lesser extent, scholarly productivity are important activities to Clark. He has delivered 128 national and international oral presentations, 13 local presentations, 28 visiting professorships and almost 20 scientific exhibits, in addition to his innumerable lectures to residents and students at McGovern Medical School. Clark has also published 29 abstracts, 43 peer-reviewed manuscripts, 13 scientific exhibits, 5 book chapters and 2 books.

**Mentoring/Advising**

Ten of Clark's mentees/advisees have served as President of the ASER, denoted here with an asterisk. Steve Hatem\*, Ron Bilow\*, Susan John\*, Stanford Goldman\*, Jorge Soto\*, Nick Beckmann, Susanna Spence, Nicks Kumaravel, Lee Myers, Suzanne Chong\*, Krystal Archer-Arroyo, Tony Wilson\*, Sanjeev Bhalla, Cookie Menias, Stephen Ledbetter\*, Clint Sliker\*, Mark Bernstein\*. He takes an active part in supporting each person in their career, role, duty, etc. I know this from firsthand experience.

I am proud to call myself his friend, colleague and mentee, and am deeply honored to have been able to present him this award at the 2025 Annual Meeting in Denver, and follow that up with this article.

The "Shan" Research Grant is named in honor of Dr. Kathirkamanathan Shanmuganathan ("Shan"), a pioneer and luminary in emergency and trauma imaging, who's untimely passing in Fall 2019 left a void in our subspecialty.

Dr. Shanmuganathan was a fellow of the American Society of Emergency Radiology and a 2014 recipient of the ASER Gold Medal. He was a prolific researcher, accomplished mentor, and master educator.

Throughout his nearly 3-decade career Dr. Shanmuganathan coauthored >100 peer-reviewed journal articles, eighteen textbooks, and innumerable abstracts.

**Award: up to \$20,000 (\$10,000 per year for two years)**

**Eligibility:**

- Principal investigator(s) must be members of the ASER, but applications can come from institutions worldwide.
- Awardees are expected to present their work at the ASER Annual Meeting during the grant award period, and to submit a manuscript from the project to the journal of Emergency Radiology.
- Applications must be for projects which are not already currently funded by grant awards from the ASER or other organizations.
